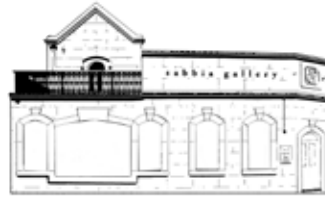

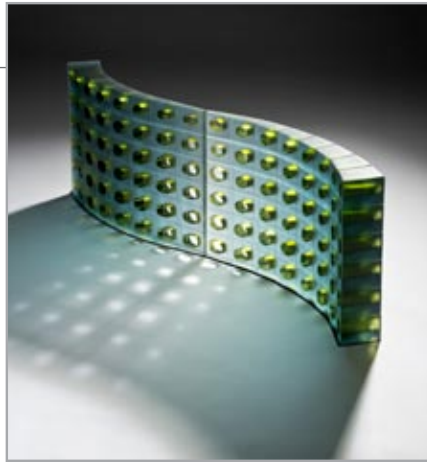

Matthew has exhibited in numerous successful solo exhibitions in Australia and abroad for over 15 years and participated in many prestigious art fairs such as SOFA in Chicago and Collect at the V&A in London. His work is widely collected in both private and public collections including the Saxe collection at the De Young Museum, San Francisco, USA; Palm Springs Museum, California, USA; The Ernsting Stifting Museum Coesfeld Germany; Wagga Wagga, National Glass Collection, Australia and the National Gallery of Australia, Canberra.

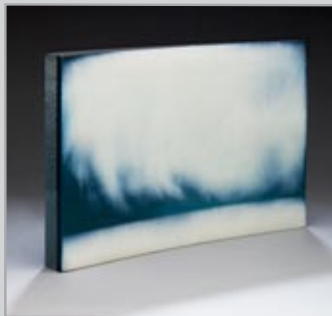

In particular, the Sunshine Coast Art Prize, Hobart City Art Prize & the Telstra National Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Art Awards, where their work was acquired for the Museum and Art Gallery of the NT collection. We are excited to be having a major exhibition of ceramics from this community of artists as part of Art Month Sydney in March 2014. 'Tjunga Warkarintja, Fifteen Years' will feature work that has been made in both Ernabella and China on recent exchanges and will include these outstanding artists.
